This is a Roll a Jack o Lantern, Halloween activity. Can be used as a math center for number recognition. Great for classroom activities, classroom Halloween party games, small group special education and occupational therapy. Students use their visual perceptual skills to plan out how to draw the picture. They may need to add a stem before the pumpkin. Where does it need to be? Students roll a die to complete the parts of a picture. Color by number page also included.

Roll it Games

Prep:

 Copy. I recommend laminating the game board for multiple uses.

Materials needed:

- * Die
- * Game board
- * Paper, white board, worksheet
- * Writing utensil

Skills:

- * Turn taking
- * Drawing/handwriting
- * Visual perceptual skills

Directions for Roll and Draw:

- Have students take turns rolling and draw each part of the picture.
- Students must draw the parts in the order that they roll. This works on visual perceptual and executive functioning skills, as they must plan out where each part will go. Challenge them to complete the drawing without erasing.


Roll and Color:




Roll a die to see what part of the jack-o-lantern you will draw or color first.
